The depicted scenes will provide the faithful that enter the Church a transition from the Old Testament (the Narthex) to the New Testament (the Nave)

The sequence Narthex, Nave, Altar is a metaphor for man's evolution toward God.

The Old Testament based Narthex Iconography would be the starting point of our many conversations about the history of the Christianity and Orthodox Church in particular.






